

# **ABOUT VISAKHAPATNAM**

Visakhapatnam is a coastal, port city, often called "The Jewel of the East Coast", located on the eastern shore of India, nestled among the hills of the Eastern Ghats and facing the Bay of Bengal to the east. It is home to the Eastern Naval Command of the Indian Navy.

The city of Vishaka, named after the god of Valor, was once a shrine built by a King of the Andhra Dynasty on his pilgrimage to Banaras. The district later became Visakhapatnam, but the shrine was believed to have been swept away by sea currents.

Inscriptions indicate that the district was originally a part of the Kalinga Kingdom subsequently conquered by the Eastern Chalukyas in the 7th Century, A.D. who ruled over it with their headquarters at Vengi. This District was also under the occupation of various rulers such as the Reddy Rajahs of Kondaveedu, the Vijayanagara of Hampi, the Gajapathis of Orissa, the Sultans of Golkonda, and the Mughal Emperor Aurangzeb through a Subedar. This territory passed on to French occupation given the succession dispute among Andhra Kings and finally, it came under the British Reign.

In 1936, the Taluks of Bissiom, Cuttack, Jayapore, Koraput, Malkanagiri, Naurangapur, Pottangi, and Rayagada were transferred to Orissa State, while Visakhapatnam District was reconstituted. The District was later bifurcated into Srikakulam and Visakhapatnam districts, and the Taluks of Vizianagaram were transferred to the newly created Vizianagaram District.

It is often called the best tourism destination in Andhra Pradesh. From Lakes to Beaches, from beautiful Hill Ranges to Caves and Valleys, Visakhapatnam has them all. The district has many tourist spots that represent the Culture and Heritage of the true India.
